(Private companies charge \$47 to \$118) - Go to www.boston.gov/registry

Minutes from the September Meeting

The incoming CGCA President and Eboard members were introduced along with the new Dorchester Reporter staff reporter Katie Trojano, as well as Amanda Curley from Councilor Frank Bakers office.

Patrick Fandel from Mayor's Office on Neighborhood Services gave an update from the Mayor's Office including Local CPA funded projects and how to apply in the future, the Boston Blooms w daffodils program application process and Climate Ready Boston program which involves long term planning and redesign of the Dorchester shoreline.

Sgt Dunford gave a public safety report and update. Burglaries and robberies are way down. He reminded residents that valuables left in cars are easy targets for quick theft and to always remove your phone, laptop, sunglasses, etc. and lock your car.

Lisa Zinck and Jill Lamonica gave an update on some of the upcoming programming at the Leahy Holloran Community Center. Fall program guides were provided.

Steve Bickerton gave an update on planning and development:

-Molinaris's Pizzeria will be coming to the October meeting to seek support for increased seating capacity and an expansion of their beer and wine license to include cordials.

-New England Millwork on Hilltop Street has been purchased by local developer Ted Ahern. There will be a robust community process as he looks to develop that property for housing.

-We have no news regarding the Blasi's building. An invitation for either or both of the Blasi brothers to come and speak to the community remains open.

-The owner of 18 Plain Street, David Higgins, has revised his proposal to demolish the existing single family home and build a 5 unit townhouse complex. Abutter support remains scarce and the planning and development committee voted to retain our current position of opposition. Should the proponent/owner gain some abutter support, we will gladly place him on a future general membership agenda. The owner was present at the meeting and claimed to have 20 letters of abutter support but he planning & development committee has yet to be provided with the letters of support.
